

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

Henderson Collegiate Charter School is participating in the Community Eligibility Provision, which provides free breakfasts and lunches for school year 2016-2017. All students enrolled at the schools may participate in the School Breakfast Program and National School Lunch Program at no charge. Household applications are not required to receive free meals. The school may distribute applications to collect household income data for other programs that require this information.

All students will be offered breakfast and lunch at no charge at all Henderson Collegiate sites.
